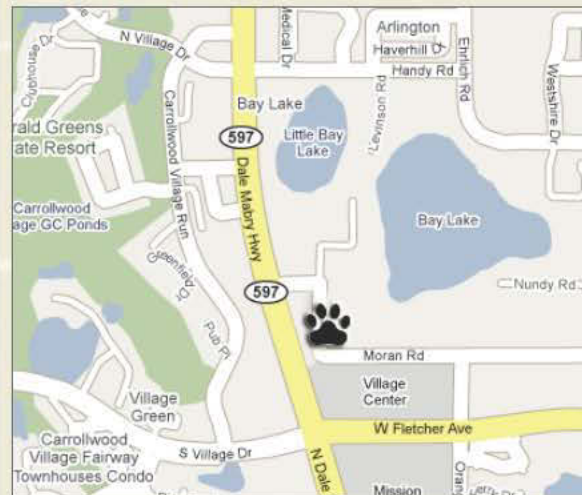

WELLNESS CARE:

Regular wellness exams are an important part of your pet's overall health care. We believe in a preventative approach and annual comprehensive physical examinations to detect and treat illnesses and prevent problems before they become life threatening. Senior pets need more care. Preventative care is very important. Older pets should visit the veterinarian at least twice a year. Health problems can develop much more rapidly in older pets.



DENTISTRY:

Dental examinations, dental cleaning and home care are necessary to prevent dental disease in your pet. Dental cleanings should be performed at least once a year. Older pets and some breeds predisposed to dental disease should have dental evaluations more frequently. Dental disease if left unchecked can lead to periodontal disease. Periodontal disease if left untreated can lead to pain, infection, tooth loss and in some cases bone loss.



LASER SURGERY:

We are pleased to offer laser surgery as an exciting new option for safe, comfortable treatment. CO2 lasers produce an invisible beam that vaporizes the water normally found in the skin and other soft tissue. Because the laser beam can be precisely controlled, it removes or "cuts" only a thin layer of tissue at one time, leaving the surrounding areas unaffected. This level of control allows your veterinarian to be extremely precise in every laser surgery procedure.
